Application Notes	HIF1a (Hypoxia-inducible factor 1-alpha) is a subunit of a transcription factor, which functions as a master transcriptional regulator of the adaptive response to hypoxia. The protein chaperone heat shock protein 90 (Hsp90) is a major regulator of different transcription factors, including HIF1a, thus a binding ELISA assay was conducted to detect the interaction of HIF1a and HSP90. Briefly, recombinant human HIF1a were diluted serially in PBS, with 0.01% BSA (pH 7.4). Duplicate samples of 100 µl were then transferred to HSP90-coated microtiter wells and incubated for 2h at 37C. Wells were washed with PBST and incubated for 1h with anti-HIF1a pAb, then aspirated and washed 3 times. After incubation with HRP labelled secondary antibody, wells were aspirated and washed 3 times. With the addition of substrate solution, wells were incubated 15-25 minutes at 37C. Finally, add 50 µl stop solution to the wells and read at 450nm immediately. The binding activity of of HIF1a and HSP90 was in a dose dependent manner.
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
